FORT SEVERN FIRST NATION

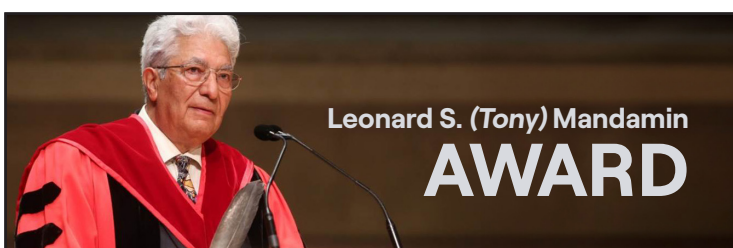
